REPORTING PRACTICE SUMMARY – 2024

Argentina continued to report **Actual Numbers** of small arms exports.

Argentina continued to report **Actual Numbers** of major conventional arms and SALW imports.

GOOD PRACTICES

Argentina disaggregated all reported transfers by weapon category, sub-category and trading partner.

Argentina provided descriptions for all reported small arms exports and imports of major conventional arms, as well as for some SALW imports.

Argentina provided comments for some reported imports.

Argentina clarified that reported imports of 'other small arms' referred to shotguns.

ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT

Argentina did not indicate whether reported imports of rifles and carbines and heavy machine guns were authorized or actual.

Argentina excluded some data for 'commercial sensitivity/national security-related' reasons, but did not specify where or what type of information was withheld.

Argentina could indicate clearly there were no imports of specific categories and sub-categories of arms, rather than leaving the relevant sections of the reporting template blank.

Argentina could provide descriptions and comments for all reported transfers.

TRANSFER SUMMARY – 2024: EXPORT DATA

- Argentina reported exports to eight countries. Of these, six were ATT States Parties, one was a Signatory and one was a non-State Party (Ecuador) at the beginning of the 2024 reporting year.¹
- Argentina did not report the export of any major conventional arms.
- Argentina reported the export of 14,031 small arms, all of which were revolvers and self-loading pistols.
- The main importers of small arms exported by Argentina were the United States (80.1 per cent), Ecuador (6.4 per cent) and Guatemala (6.4 per cent).

TRANSFER SUMMARY – 2024: IMPORT DATA

- Argentina reported imports from nine countries. Of these, seven were ATT States Parties and two were Signatories.
- Argentina reported the import of one manned combat aircraft from the United States.
- Argentina reported the import of 21,844 small arms and light weapons covering four sub-categories. The vast majority were revolvers and self-loading pistols (42.5 per cent), rifles and carbines (37.3 per cent) and shotguns reported as 'other small arms' (20.2 per cent).
- The main exporters of SALW to Argentina were the United States (25.7 per cent), Brazil (21.9 per cent) and Türkiye (20.6 per cent).

¹ Ecuador is listed as a non-State Party because it became an ATT State Party on 26 May 2026.
