REPORTING PRACTICE SUMMARY – 2024

Guyana submitted an annual report for the first time in 2024.

Guyana submitted a 'nil' report for exports.

Guyana reported **Actual Numbers** of small arms imports.

GOOD PRACTICES

Guyana clearly indicated there were no reported imports in specific categories and sub-categories of arms.

Guyana submitted a 'nil' report for exports, indicating clearly it had no transfers to report.

Guyana provided descriptions for most reported small arms imports.

ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT

Guyana aggregated the exporters of small arms imports, making it impossible to determine how many items came from each country.

Guyana could provide descriptions and comments for all reported transfers.

Guyana may consider listing imports of shotguns under 'other small arms', instead of creating a new sub-category in the ATT reporting template.

TRANSFER SUMMARY – 2024: EXPORT DATA

- Guyana submitted a 'nil' report for exports.

TRANSFER SUMMARY – 2024: IMPORT DATA

- Guyana reported imports from seven countries. Of these, six were ATT States Parties and one was a Signatory.
- Guyana did not report the import of any major conventional arms.
- Guyana reported the import of 3,288 small arms covering four sub-categories. The majority were revolvers and self-loading pistols (68.0 per cent), assault rifles (15.2 per cent) and shotguns (13.2 per cent).
