### REPORTING PRACTICE SUMMARY - 2022

Austria's reporting changed in 2022.

Austria reported a combination of **Authorized** and **Actual Numbers** of SALW exports, a change from 2021 when it reported **Authorized** and **Actual Values**.

**GOOD PRACTICES**

Austria reported numbers of all its reported exports.

**ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT**

Austria aggregated all transfers by weapon type in its 2022 report, making it impossible to determine weapon sub-categories.

Austria could indicate clearly that there were no reported exports or imports in specific weapons categories and sub-categories rather than leaving relevant sections of the reporting template blank.

Austria could provide descriptions and comments describing the nature of more of its reported exports.

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: EXPORT DATA**

- Austria reported exports to 79 countries in 2022. Of these, 52 were ATT States Parties, six were Signatories and 14 were non-members (Algeria, Azerbaijan, India, Indonesia, Jordan, Kenya, Kuwait, Kyrgyzstan, Oman, Qatar, Tajikistan, Tunisia, Uganda and Viet Nam).<sup>1</sup>
- Austria did not report exports of major conventional weapons in its 2022 annual report.
- Austria reported the export of 107,398 SALW.
- The main importers of small arms from Austria were the United States (60.8 per cent), Brazil (4.8 per cent) and Norway (4.4 per cent).

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: IMPORT DATA**

- Austria did not report imports of major conventional weapons or SALW in its 2022 annual report.

<sup>1</sup> Austria also reported exports to seven non-UN members (Curaçao, Greenland, Kosovo, New Caledonia, Taiwan and Tanzania).
