REPORTING PRACTICE SUMMARY - 2022

El Salvador's reporting changed in 2022. It submitted a publicly available report after keeping its 2021 report confidential.

El Salvador submitted a 'nil' report for exports.

El Salvador reported **Authorized Numbers** of small arms imports.

**GOOD PRACTICES**

El Salvador submitted a 'nil' report for exports, indicating clearly it had no transfers to report in 2022.

**ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT**

El Salvador reported aggregated numbers of small arms imports, making it impossible to determine the specific exporting states of the reported small arms.

El Salvador could provide descriptions and comments describing the nature of its reported imports.

El Salvador could indicate clearly that there were no reported imports in specific weapons categories and sub-categories rather than leaving relevant sections of the reporting template blank.

- El Salvador submitted a 'nil' report for exports.

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: IMPORT DATA**

- El Salvador reported imports from seven countries in 2022. Of these, four were ATT States Parties and three were Signatories.
- El Salvador did not report imports of major conventional weapons in its 2022 annual report.
- El Salvador reported the import of 7,224 small arms. These were 6,794 revolvers and self-loading pistols (94 per cent) and 430 rifles and carbines (6 per cent).
