REPORTING PRACTICE SUMMARY - 2022

Estonia's reporting changed slightly in 2022.

Estonia reported **Actual Numbers** of SALW exports, as opposed to 2021 when it reported mainly **Authorized Numbers**.

Estonia continued to report **Actual Numbers** of major conventional weapons and **Actual Numbers** of SALW imports.

**GOOD PRACTICES**

Estonia provided disaggregated numbers for its small arms imports, both by weapon type and by exporting state.

Estonia provided descriptions of imports reported under the large-caliber artillery systems sub-category.

**ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT**

Estonia could provide descriptions and comments on the nature of all its reported exports and imports.

Estonia did not provide information on final exporting states for its reported imports of small arms.

Estonia could indicate clearly that there were no reported exports or imports in specific weapons categories and sub-categories rather than leaving relevant sections of the reporting template blank.

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: EXPORT DATA**

- Estonia reported exports to ten countries in 2022. Of these, nine were ATT States Parties and one was a non-member (India).
- Estonia did not report exports of major conventional weapons in its 2022 annual report.
- Estonia reported the export of 532 small arms, covering three sub-categories. These were revolvers and self-loading pistols (57.3 per cent), rifles and carbines (32.7 per cent) and 'others' (smooth-bore shotguns) (10 per cent).
- The main importers of small arms from Estonia were Lithuania (57.9 per cent), Latvia (30.5 per cent) and India (6.6 per cent).

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: IMPORT DATA**

- Estonia reported the import of 12 major conventional weapons items, all of which were large-caliber artillery systems.
- Estonia reported the import of 3,498 small arms, covering three sub-categories. These were revolvers and self-loading pistols (60.5 per cent), rifles and carbines (31.4 per cent) and 'others' (small arms) (8.2 per cent).
