REPORTING PRACTICE SUMMARY - 2022

Jamaica's reporting changed slightly in 2022.

Jamaica continued to report **Authorized Numbers** of small arms exports and imports. It reported **Actual Numbers** of major conventional weapons imports.



GOOD PRACTICES

Jamaica indicated that exports and imports reported in the small arms 'others' sub-categories were shotguns.



ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT

Jamaica aggregated numbers of exports and imports of small arms items by country, making it impossible to determine how many items of each weapon were exported or imported by each reported state.

Jamaica could provide comments and descriptions on the nature of all its reported transfers.

Jamaica could indicate clearly that there were no reported exports or imports in specific weapons categories and sub-categories rather than leaving relevant sections of the reporting template blank.



TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: EXPORT DATA

- Jamaica reported exports to ten countries in 2022. Of these, eight were ATT States Parties and two were Signatories.
- Jamaica did not report exports of major conventional weapons in its 2022 annual report.
- Jamaica reported the export of 385 small arms covering six sub-categories. Of these, the majority were rifles and carbines (54.5 per cent), revolvers and self-loading pistols (31.4 per cent) and assault rifles (6.5 per cent).



TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: IMPORT DATA

- Jamaica reported imports from 12 countries in 2022. Of these, ten were ATT States Parties and two were Signatories.
- Jamaica reported the import of six armoured combat vehicles from Australia.
- Jamaica reported the import of 4,309 SALW items covering six sub-categories. Of these, the majority were revolvers and self-loading pistols (51.5 per cent), rifles and carbines (31.4 per cent) and 'others' (small arms) (16.2 per cent).
