REPORTING PRACTICE SUMMARY - 2022

Netherlands continued to report **Actual Numbers** of major conventional weapons and small arms exports. It reported **Actual** exports of light weapons but withheld the number of items transferred.

Netherlands continued to report **Actual Numbers** of major conventional weapons and SALW imports.

**GOOD PRACTICES**

Netherlands provided clear, disaggregated information for each reported export and import.

Netherlands provided descriptions and comments for all light weapons exports.

Netherlands specified in some places where information was withheld for 'commercial sensitivity/national security related' reasons.

Netherlands reported the state of origin of some of its reported exports.

**ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT**

Netherlands could provide descriptions and comments describing the nature of more of its reported small arms exports.

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: EXPORT DATA**

- Netherlands reported exports to 28 countries in 2022. Of these, 25 were ATT States Parties and three were Signatories.
- Netherlands reported the export of 204 major conventional weapons, covering two categories. In terms of numbers, the majority of these were armoured combat vehicles (96.1 per cent) and large-caliber artillery systems (3.9 per cent) exported to Ukraine. Netherlands also reported the export of missile and missile launchers (missiles, etc.) to Ukraine but withheld the number of items transferred.
- Netherlands reported the export of 15,253 small arms covering six sub-categories. Of these, the majority were revolvers and self-loading pistols (32.1 per cent), light machine guns (31.4 per cent) and sub-machine guns (28.1 per cent).
- The main importers of small arms from Netherlands were the United States (43.5 per cent), Lithuania (40.7 per cent) and Belgium (3.8 per cent).

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: IMPORT DATA**

- Netherlands reported imports from 24 countries in 2022. Of these, 22 were ATT States Parties, one was a Signatory and the other was a non-member (Belarus).
- Netherlands reported the import of nine manned combat aircraft from Italy.
- Netherlands reported the import of 12,282 SALW items covering seven sub-categories. Of these, the majority were light machine guns (40.4 per cent), rifles and carbines (27 per cent) and revolvers and self-loading pistols (17.2 per cent).
- The main exporters of SALW to Netherlands were Austria (23 per cent), Czech Republic (22.2 per cent) and Poland (14.3 per cent).
