REPORTING PRACTICE SUMMARY - 2022

Peru's reporting changed slightly in 2022.

Peru continued to submit a 'nil' report for exports.

Peru continued to report **Authorized** and **Actual Numbers** of major conventional weapons and SALW imports, a shift from 2021 when it reported **Actual Numbers** of small arms imports and **Authorized** and **Actual Numbers** of light weapons imports.

Peru continued to report **Values** of some of its reported transfers.

**GOOD PRACTICES**

Peru provided clear, disaggregated data for all reported imports.

Peru provided numbers and values for most of its major conventional weapons and SALW imports, except for donations.

Peru provided descriptions and comments describing the nature and end-use of all reported imports, which are consistent and detailed.

Peru submitted a 'nil' report for exports, indicating clearly it had no exports to report in 2022.

Peru reported the state of origin of all its reported imports.

**ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT**

Peru could indicate which reported transfers were authorized and which ones were actual.

Peru could indicate clearly that there were no reported imports in specific major conventional weapons categories and sub-categories rather than leaving relevant sections of the reporting template blank.

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: EXPORT DATA**

- Peru submitted a 'nil' report for exports.

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: IMPORT DATA**

- Peru reported imports from 14 countries in 2022. Of these, 11 were ATT States Parties and three were Signatories.
- Peru reported the import of three major conventional weapons items, covering two categories. Peru reported the import of two armoured combat vehicles from Germany with a total value of US\$598,000¹ and a warship that was a donation from the Republic of Korea.
- Peru reported the import of 18,317 SALW items covering four sub-categories with a total value of US\$7.7m.² In terms of numbers, the majority were 'others' (small arms) (91.9 per cent), revolvers and self-loading pistols (5.3 per cent) and assault rifles (2.8 per cent).
- The main exporters of SALW to Peru were Brazil (29.7 per cent), United States (27.2 per cent) and Türkiye (17.3 per cent).
