### REPORTING PRACTICE SUMMARY - 2022

Romania continued to report **Actual Numbers** of major conventional weapons and SALW imports.



### GOOD PRACTICES

Romania provided clear, disaggregated data on all reported exports and imports.

Romania provided descriptions of the majority of its transfers and, in many cases, comments describing the nature of its exports and imports.

Romania indicated clearly that there were no reported exports or imports in some weapons categories and sub-categories.

Romania reported the state of origin of some of its reported exports and imports.



### ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT

Romania excluded some data for 'commercial sensitivity/national security-related' reasons but did not specify where or how much information was withheld.

Romania could provide more comments and descriptions on the nature of all its reported transfers.



### TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: EXPORT DATA

- Romania reported exports to eight countries in 2022. Of these, five were ATT States Parties, one was a Signatory and two were non-members (Iraq and Somalia).
- Romania did not report exports of major conventional weapons in its 2022 annual report.
- Romania reported the export of 66,105 SALW items, covering six sub-categories. Of these, the majority were revolvers and self-loading pistols (48.7 per cent), assault rifles (25.5 per cent) and rifles and carbines (23.7 per cent).
- The main importers of SALW from Romania were the United States (71.4 per cent), Bulgaria (17 per cent) and Iraq (10.4 per cent).



### TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: IMPORT DATA

- Romania reported imports from 15 countries in 2022. Of these, 12 were ATT States Parties and three were Signatories.
- Romania reported the import of 707 major conventional weapons items, covering three categories. These were missiles and missile launchers (missiles, etc.) (79.1 per cent), large-caliber artillery systems (19.5 per cent) and armoured combat vehicles (1.4 per cent). The exporters of major conventional weapons to Romania were the United States (79.1 per cent), Bulgaria (19.5 per cent) and Israel (1.4 per cent).
- Romania reported the import of 18,490 SALW items, covering seven sub-categories. Of these, the majority were portable anti-tank missile launchers and rocket systems (30.2 per cent), revolvers and self-loading pistols (26.1 per cent) and rifles and carbines (24 per cent).
- The main exporters of SALW to Romania were Bulgaria (47 per cent), Austria (18.7 per cent) and Czech Republic (10.8 per cent).
