REPORTING PRACTICE SUMMARY - 2022

Sweden's reporting changed slightly in 2022.

Sweden reported some **Numbers** for exports of major conventional weapons and light weapons, whereas in 2021 it classified and left the values blank for actual exports of these categories. Sweden did not report any small arms exports in 2022; however, in 2021 it reported small arms exports under voluntary national categories as ML1 items.

Sweden did not report any small arms imports in 2022.

**GOOD PRACTICES**

Sweden provided descriptions for all major conventional weapons and light weapons exports.

Sweden specified where information was withheld for 'commercial sensitivity/national security-related' reasons and for which weapon sub-category (missiles and missile launchers, portable anti-tank missile launchers and rocket systems and 'others' (light weapons)).

Sweden indicated clearly that there were no reported exports or imports in specific weapons categories and sub-categories.

Sweden provided descriptions of the reported exports under the light weapons 'others' category.

**ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT**

Sweden could provide comments describing the nature of all of its exports.

Sweden aggregated the final importing countries of its light weapons exports, making it impossible to determine the final destinations of the transfers.

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: EXPORT DATA**

- Sweden reported exports to 11 countries in 2022. Of these, ten were States Parties and one was a Signatory.
- Sweden reported the export of four manned combat aircraft to Brazil.
- Sweden reported the imports of 'others' (light weapons), portable anti-tank missile launchers and rocket systems and recoilless rifles. It withheld the number of items involved in each transfer.

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: IMPORT DATA**

- Sweden did not report imports in its 2022 annual report.
