REPORTING PRACTICE SUMMARY - 2022

Uruguay's reporting changed in 2022.

Uruguay continued to report a 'nil' report for exports.

Uruguay reported **Actual Numbers** of major conventional weapons imports and continued to report **Actual Numbers** of SALW imports.

**GOOD PRACTICES**

Uruguay submitted a 'nil' report for exports, indicating clearly that it had no exports to report in 2022.

Uruguay provided disaggregated numbers for its imports by weapon type.

Uruguay provided descriptions for all of its SALW imports as well as comments for all of its major conventional weapons imports.

Uruguay indicated clearly that there were no reported imports in specific weapons categories and sub-categories rather than leaving relevant sections of the reporting template blank.

Uruguay provided descriptions of the reported imports under the light weapons 'others' category.

**ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT**

Uruguay could provide descriptions for its major conventional weapons imports as well as comments describing the nature of its reported SALW imports.

Uruguay did not provide information on final exporting states for its reported imports of small arms and for some major conventional weapons.

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: EXPORT DATA**

- Uruguay submitted a 'nil' report for exports.

**TRANSFER SUMMARY - 2022: IMPORT DATA**

- Uruguay reported imports from eight countries in 2022. Of these, five were ATT States Parties and three were Signatories.
- Uruguay reported the import of 21 major conventional weapons items, covering two categories. These were battle tanks (52.4 per cent) and armoured combat vehicles (47.6 per cent).
- Uruguay reported the import of 3,706 SALW items, covering three sub-categories. Of these, the majority were rifles and carbines (54.7 per cent), 'others' (light weapons) (43.6 per cent) and revolvers and self-loading pistols (1.7 per cent).
- The main reported exporters of SALW to Uruguay were Brazil (17.8 per cent), United States (7.7 per cent) and Austria (6.5 per cent). Uruguay did not report the final exporting state of 56.4 per cent of its reported imports.
